All local fire departments were awarded these grants based on recommendations from nine major national fire service organizations. Many fire and rescue departments applied for the grants, but only the applications most closely conforming to program priorities were reviewed and scored by peer review panels.

In Fiscal Year 2006, the DHS Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program will award approximately \$ **485 million** directly to fire departments and emergency medical service (EMS) organizations to

enhance their ability to protect the health and safety of the public, as well as that of first-responder personnel, with respect to fire and fire related hazards.
