

WASHINGTON-Congressman Spencer Bachus, responding to concerns by St.Clair County officials, secured \$100,000 in federally appropriated funding for the St.Clair County Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff's Office was selected as one of the recipients for a grant under the Law Enforcement Technology Program to purchase new technology and modernize equipment.

"With 2 Interstate Highways running through St. Clair County, and a fast growing population, St. Clair County's government has well publicized funding restraints. St. Clair County officials expressed their need for funds to modernize the Sheriff's Department's equipment and technology. I am glad I had the opportunity to address those needs", Bachus said.

The St. Clair County Commission was instrumental in presenting the county's need for technological upgrades to Congressman Bachus. "I am excited that the Congressman was able to secure new technological advances for the sheriff's office. Both the sheriff and I are proud of our involvement with Congressman Bachus in securing these funds", St. Clair County Commission President Stan Batemon said.
