

WASHINGTON – Congressman Spencer Bachus (AL-6) today voted to repeal a costly new tax mandate on small businesses.

The House passed legislation to repeal the so-called “1099” tax reporting requirement in the new health care law. Bachus was a cosponsor of the legislation.

Bachus issued the following statement.□

□□□□□□□□□□ **“Among the many onerous provisions of Obamacare is a mandate that small businesses file 1099 forms with the IRS for any purchase of more than \$600.□ This would cost small businesses nearly \$20□ billion in new taxes and subject them to endless hours of expensive paperwork.□ Small businesses generate the majority of new jobs in our country and this is no time to impose higher regulatory costs on them to fund a costly government takeover of health care.□ Finally, if there is any government agency that doesn’t need to get bigger, it’s the IRS.”**
